Minutes of the XXXIVth Meeting of the Senate held on 11.09.2023

The XXXIVth Meeting of the Senate of NIT Meghalaya was held on 11th Sep 2023, at the Conference Room of the Institute through hybrid mode from 3:00 PM onwards. The following members attended the meeting:

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At the outset, the Chairman, Senate welcomed the members and the special invitees to the thirty fourth meeting of the Senate. Thereafter, the agenda items of the day were taken up.

Item No.1: Confirmation of Minutes of the XXXIIIrd Meeting of the Senate of NIT Meghalaya held on 07.06.2023.

The Thirty Third meeting of the Senate of the Institute was held on 07.06.2023 in the Conference Room of the Institute through hybrid mode. The minutes of the meeting were circulated amongst the distinguished members of the Senate for their comments/observations. However, no comments were received from the members.

<u>R1/SENATE-XXXIV/23</u>: The Senate **Resolved to Confirm** the minutes of the XXXIIIrd Senate Meeting held on 7th June 2023.

Item No.2: Actions Taken Report on the Decision of the XXXIIIrd Meeting of the Senate.

The actions taken on the decisions of the XXXIIIrd Meeting of the Senate were presented during the meeting and the Senate members noted the actions taken by the Institute.

<u>R2/SENATE-XXXIV/23</u>: The Senate **Noted and Confirmed** the actions taken on the resolutions of the XXXIIIrd Senate Meeting after recommending to do a brain storming on ways to improve student intake in the M.Tech Programme. It was also recommended to consider introducing Interdisciplinary/Multidisciplinary M.Tech Programmes, Integrated

M.Tech-Ph.D Programme, etc.

Items for Approval

Item No. 3: Proposals for Amendment in the Ordinance:

A) Ph.D & Post Doc Ordinances

1) Admission Criteria for Ph.D. Full Time:

Master's degree in Engineering/ Science/ Technology/ Humanities and Social Sciences/ Management Sciences/ or Master's degree in the allied subjects with consistently good academic record and a minimum of first class (if class is not mentioned in the transcript/certificate then minimum 60% marks or 6.5 CGPA) in the Master's degree. Candidates with B.E./ B. Tech. with an aggregate of 75% marks or equivalent GPA with valid GATE score will also be eligible. Candidates applying for the Programme must clear the Institute entrance exam and interview for admission.

R3(A-1)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** the admission criteria for *Ph.D. Full Time as proposed.*

2) Minimum Publication Requirements for Pre-Submission:

A Ph. D scholar may submit his/ her thesis (along with Form IX) within the stipulated period but not later than two months from the date of pre-submission seminar provided he/she fulfils all requisites and critical dates from point D.7, for Ph. D thesis with a substantial accepted/published minimum papers work two (2)in а refereed journal (Scopus/SCI/SCIE/SSCI/AHCI) as first author, out of which at least one (1) should be a SCI/SCIE (SSCI/AHCI for Humanities and Social Sciences) journal as first author. This amendment shall be applicable from Autumn 2023 admission onwards.

R3(A-2)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** the minimum publication requirements for pre-submission as proposed.

3) Minimum Publication Requirements for Early Submission:

Accepted/Published at least three (3) papers in referred journal (Scopus/SCI/SSCI/AHCI) as first author of which, at least two (2) are in referred SCI/SCIE (SSCI/AHCI for Humanities and Social Sciences) journals as first author, and one (1) in Q1 journal as first author. This amendment shall be applicable from Autumn 2022 admission onwards.

R3(A-3)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** the minimum publication requirements for Early Submission as proposed.

4) Eligibility for Applying Under Institute Post-Doctoral Fellowship (IPDF):

Ph.D students, who have submitted their thesis, are also eligible to apply. If selected, he/ she will not be offered any fellowship amount till the award of Ph.D degree. However, they have to submit the provisional/degree certificate within 1 month from the date of appointment as an Institute PDF failing which, the appointment will stand cancelled.

R3(A-4)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** the eligibility for Institute Post-Doctoral Fellowship (IPDF) as proposed.

5) Proposal for Institute Fellowship to Ph.D Scholars under Sponsored Projects:

It was proposed to provide Institute Scholarship to the eligible candidates under Sponsored Projects for minimum 2 years after completion of the project. However, total fellowship/scholarship received should not exceed 5 years.

- Project Fellows from Science/Humanities Disciplines must be GATE/NET qualified in order to be eligible for receiving the Institute scholarship.
- If the project fellow perusing full time Ph. D Programme is not GATE/NET qualified at the time the project completes, he/she may apply for Institute Scholarship after qualifying the same during the period of the Programme. However, he/she will receive the Institute scholarship only for the approved period of years or till thesis submission, whichever is earlier.

R3(A-5)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** the above mentioned proposal after recommending that normal admission procedure, as followed by the other candidates, must be applicable for the Project Fellows willing to enroll into the Ph.D Programme of the Institute.

6) Monitoring the Progress of Ph.D. Scholars:

In order to continue research, the scholar shall renew his/her studentship by completing the necessary formalities in each semester. Progress seminar shall be conducted **at least once** in a year during the Spring Session and shall be evaluated as per prescribed format (Form-IV D).

- Ph. D. scholars shall submit a progress report in the prescribed format before the DC and subsequently shall have to present a progress seminar before the DC members within the date to be notified by the Academic Section.
- The DRC shall send the reports to the Academic Section for appraisal of the Dean (AA) with anyone of the following recommendations: a) Allowed to enroll in the next semester and continue research; b) allowed to enroll and continue research but with suggestions for improvement; c) As the performance is very poor advised to discontinue.

R3(A-6)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** monitoring the progress of *Ph.D.* scholars as proposed above and recommended that it should be applicable to all the scholars with effect from the date of notifying.

7) Formation of Doctoral Committee:

The formation of the DC shall be initiated by the Supervisor(s) to monitor the progress of each of the research scholars.

The DC shall consist of the following:

i. Supervisor, Convener

Members Nominated by Supervisor:

ii. Co-Supervisor*, Member-1

iii. A faculty member (otherwise eligible to be supervisor, of the concerned research group of the Department/Centre), Member- 2

iv. One faculty member (otherwise eligible to be supervisor, of the concerned Department/Centre), Member- 3

v. One faculty member, from other Department/Centre or from the other Institute of repute, Member- 4

Members to be nominated by Dean (AA):

vi. A Senior faculty member, Chairman

* For Full Time Ph.D. scholars, if needed, a Co-Supervisor may be allotted as per the guidelines mentioned in "Recognition of Supervisor/Co-Supervisor" in the Ordinance. External Co-Supervisor needs to be from recognized universities/ institutes/ organizations/industries.

R3(A-7)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** the formation of Doctoral Committee as proposed and further **Authorized** the Chairman Senate to take the call on appointment of Co-Supervisors, on need basis.

B) Evaluation Procedure across UG, PG & Ph.D Programmes:

The evaluation process shall be of continuous nature as follows:

- i. Complete evaluation and award of grades shall normally be done by the faculty members teaching the course.
- ii. Under special circumstances, the Competent Authority will have the discretion to appoint any other teacher or external examiner for setting question papers and/or evaluating the answer scripts.
- iii. The evaluation scheme shall be for **Total Marks: 200**

1) Internal Assessments*	a) Class Tests (Min 2)	30 Marks

2) Mid Term Exam		50 Marks
3) End Term Exam		100 Marks

Relative grading system to be followed.

Note: It was further proposed to conduct one special exam for the final year students during Autumn 2023, so that the students who could not clear few courses due to the prevailing criteria (must secure minimum 70 marks (35%) out of the total 200 marks and minimum 30 marks out of 100 marks in the End Term Exam) may get a chance to clear the courses and avail placement opportunities.

R3(B)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Recommended to form a Committee** to evaluate the existing Evaluation Scheme and present the updated proposal in the next Senate Meeting. However, the Senate **Approved** the proposal of conducting one special exam for the final year students during Autumn 2023, in order to give them a chance to clear the courses and avail placement opportunities.

Item No. 4: Changes in Curriculum/Courses

a) EE & ME departments jointly prepared an integrated Lab Course for 1 Credit (under Value Added Courses (VAC) to be offered to the 2nd Semester UG students w.e.f. AY 2023-24 as a Do-it-yourself (DIY) course. The course code would be **VA102**. The syllabus of VA102 and revised curriculum of 1st year were presented before the Senate.

R4(a)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** the course and **Recommended** to replace the title of the course with a better alternative.

b) It was proposed to revise the syllabus of an existing open elective course, ME272, "Product Design and Development" to make it a blended special course for all 4th semester students, where the students will learn theory of design and prototype, as well as hands-on

experience in the practical. The course credit will be converted from 2-0-0:2 to 1-0-2:2. The evaluation of the course will be same as of a lab course. Upon approval of Senate, the Engineering Departments will be asked to prepare department specific syllabi for the same and place before the Senate for approval. The revised course will be effective for AY23-24 batch.

R4(b)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Recommended** to place the matter in the next Senate Meeting after placing the same in the APC.

c) It was proposed that B. Tech students should attend two Summer Internships, preferably in the industry. Once after 4th Semester and the other after 6th Semester. Both shall be evaluated at the beginning of the 7th Semester.

R4(c)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** by recommending that the Summer Internships should be of at least eight weeks, which can be split over two summer breaks with at least four weeks each. It was also recommended to increase the credit assigned to two (2) credits from existing one (1) credit.

d) It was proposed that M. Sc students should attend one Summer Internship after 2nd Semester. It will be evaluated at the beginning of the 3rd Semester with a credit structure of (0-0-0:1). Revised Curriculum Structure was presented.

R4(d)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Recommended** that instead of mandatory Summer Internship, the Science Departments may advise the students to opt for internships/outreach activities during the summer break.

e) The DAC of CY Dept. proposed to introduce two elective courses: "Machine Learning in Chemistry" and "Bioanalytic Techniques". The Syllabi were are presented during the meeting.

R4(e)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Recommended** to revise the syllabus for "Machine Learning in Chemistry" by incorporating some applications to chemistry-oriented topics while approving the proposal to introduce "Bioanalytic Techniques" as an elective course.

f) The DAC of EC Dept. has proposed to change the name of the course, EC 415, from existing "Wireless Communication" to "Wireless Communication Systems: 5G & Beyond" while the course code and the credit remains the same (EC 415, 3-0-0:3).

R4(f)/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** the change in the Title of the course to "Wireless Communication Systems: 5G & Beyond" as proposed.

Item No. 5: Minutes of XXIXth APC Meeting

The XXIXth Meeting of the Academic Programmes Committee was held on 5th Sep 2023 to discuss matters related to academic affairs. The minutes of the meeting was presented during the meeting:

R5/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Recommended** to incorporate the suggestions given by the Senate in the agenda items pertaining to the APC minutes.

Item No. 6: Grade Change Appeals, Spring 2023

Twenty-six applications were received from the UG students for Grade Change and the same were forwarded to the respective departments for recommendations which were further analyzed by the UGPEC on 28th Aug 2023. None of the students were recommended for grade change after evaluation by the respective course instructors and the reasons were

found to be satisfactory to the UGPEC members too. A report on the same was presented to the Senate.

R6/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** the decisions made by the respective departments and the UGPEC as proposed.

Item No. 7: Conversion of Category to Part Time in Ph.D

The Senate was briefed about an application received from a full time scholar, Mr. Ajay Anand, Roll No- P22EE006, to convert to Part Time Category as he has been selected as an Assistant Professor in Bihar Government Engineering through Bihar Public Service Commission. The Senate discussed on the matter, but as the scholar had not completed one year from the date of Ph. D Registration as required by the norms, the appeal of the scholar was hence not accepted.

R7/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved not to Approve** the request made by the scholar to convert to part time scholar as he has not fulfilled the criteria for conversion as per rules.

Item No. 8: Appeal to Re-Appear 1st Semester during Autumn 2023

The Senate was briefed about an application received from a B. Tech student, Mr. Bhaskar Das, Roll No: B22EE003, requesting to re-appear in the 1st Semester during Autumn 2023, as he suffered from medical issues. The student also did not register for the second semester during Spring 2023. A medical certificate has been submitted along with the application.

R8/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** the student to register as a special case and further recommended to allow registration for Autumn 2023 without paying the fees for Spring 2023.

Item No. 9: List of B. Tech, M. Tech, M. Sc and Ph. D students qualifying for the award of degree during the 10th Convocation of the Institute.

The Senate was appraised that a total of 147 B.Tech students, 26 M. Tech students and 31 M.Sc students have completed the requirements of the Programme during June-July, 2023. Further, 27 scholars (numbers are likely to increase before the Convocation) are also eligible for the award of Ph.D degree in the upcoming 10th Convocation of the Institute.

R9/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Recommend** the list of degree recipients worthy of receiving the degree in the upcoming 10th Convocation of the Institute, to the BoG for approval.

Item No.10: Recommendation of Senate Nominees to BoG

The Senate was briefed that the tenure of the present Senate Nominees to the Board of Governors, viz, Prof. H. C. Das and Assoc. Professor, Dr. G.K. Dutta is expiring on 28.09.2023. In view of this, a poll was conducted to nominate the two new members and Professor, Ayon Bhattacharjee from Physics Department and Assoc. Professor, Dr. D. K. Sarma have been nominated as Senate Nominees to the BoG.

R10/SENATE-XXXIV/23: The Senate **Resolved to Approve** Professor, Ayon Bhattacharjee and Assoc. Professor, Dr. D. K. Sarma as Senate Nominees to the BoG after the tenure of the current members get over on 28th Sep, 2023.

Item No.11: Nominations of External Senate Members

The Senate was briefed about the existing External Senate Members of the Institute and considering the long tenures served by Prof. N. C. Shivaprakash and Prof. Naliniprava Tripathy, two new Senate Members were proposed for new appointment for a period of 3 ears from the date of appointment. Both of the existing Senate members were thanked for their immense contributions to the Institute.
